

Privacy Policy

This privacy statement is applicable to cenaclesisters.org.

The Cenacle Sisters policy is to respect and protect the privacy of our users.

The Cenacle Sisters do not collect personally identifiable information about individuals except when such individuals specifically provide such information on a voluntary basis. For example, such personally identifiable information may be gathered from an e-mail request for information or service from a ministry of the Cenacle Sisters.

Personally identifiable information on individual users will not be sold or otherwise transferred to unaffiliated third parties without the approval of the user at the time of collection.

The Cenacle Sisters may disclose user information in special cases when we have reason to believe that disclosing this information is necessary to identify, contact or bring legal action against someone who may be causing injury to or interference with (either intentionally or unintentionally) the Cenacle Sisters rights or property, other Cenacle users, or anyone else that could be harmed by such activities. The Cenacle Sisters may disclose user information when we believe in good faith that the law requires it.

The Cenacle Sisters reserve the right to perform statistical analyses of user behavior and characteristics in order to measure interest in and use of the various areas of the site.

In the future, users should be aware that when they voluntarily disclose personally identifiable information (e.g., user name, e-mail address) on bulletin boards or in the chat areas that may be developed and implemented on the Cenacle website, that information, along with any substantive information disclosed in the user's communication, can be collected and correlated and used by third parties and may result in unsolicited messages from other posters or third parties. Such activities are beyond the control of the Cenacle Sisters.

Users also should be aware that non-personal information and data may be automatically collected through the standard operation of the Cenacle Sisters Internet servers or through the use of "cookies." Cookies are small text files a website can use to recognize repeat users, facilitate the user's ongoing access to and use of the site and allow the Cenacle Sisters to track usage behavior and compile aggregate data that will allow content improvements. Cookies are not programs that come onto a user's system and damage files. Generally, cookies work by assigning a unique number to the user that has no meaning outside the assigning site. Users should be aware that the Cenacle Sisters cannot or do not control the use of cookies or the resulting information by third parties hosting data for the Cenacle Sisters. If a user does not want information collected through the use of cookies, there is a simple procedure in most browsers that allows the user to deny or accept the cookie feature; however, users should note that cookies may be necessary to provide the user with certain features available on the Cenacle Sisters website.

The foregoing policies are effective as of April 1, 2008. The Cenacle Sisters reserves the right to change this policy at any time by notifying users of the existence of a new privacy statement. This statement and the policies outlined herein are not intended to and do not create any contractual or other legal rights in or on behalf of any party.
